* All ND LTAP workshops and short courses attended since Jan. 1, 1998 are eligible for Road Scholar credit. However, to be eligible, our records must verify your attendance.

* The Road Scholar program is a voluntary program. If you enroll in the program and decide later to stop participating, there is no obligation to continue. You will have gained valuable knowledge and skills from each workshop you attended, and you may rejoin the program without any loss of previously earned program credits.

* There is no obligation to enroll in the Road Scholar program. You may register and attend any ND LTAP/TLN sponsored workshops even if you are not a Road Scholar participant. Everyone on our distribution list will be notified of upcoming workshops. All workshops sponsored by NDLTAP will be posted on the ND LTAP website.

What Is a Road Scholar Program?

The North Dakota Local Technical Assistance Program has developed a Road Scholar Program for road and highway practitioners in North Dakota. It recognizes each participant’s achievement in subjects and topics essential to efficient and effective local road maintenance and management.

Your participation in the Road Scholar program will increase your knowledge and awareness of how and why the road systems must be properly managed. The ideas, knowledge, and skills you gain through LTAP training will help you on the job, strengthen your agency, preserve the roadway infrastructure, and reduce the cost of maintaining the roadways.

Road Scholar Levels of Training

Level I - requires completing a minimum of 5 courses (30 hours) of instruction from the required courses.

Level II - requires completing 60 additional hours of training. This can be either basic courses or elective courses.

What Courses are Offered?

Basic workshop short courses offered by LTAP and additional Transportation Learning Network (TLN) courses supported by LTAP will qualify as the required core courses and elective courses, which are posted on our website (www.ndltap.org). Most LTAP courses are for 6 hour credit. Both LTAP and TLN courses will be identified as “basic” or “elective,” with hours of credit identified as they scheduled.

Other Qualifying Courses

North Dakota Association of Counties “Institute of Local Government” (ILG) conducts workshops which may be of interest and importance to road department personnel. The ILG workshops will be eligible for the elective courses needed for the road scholar certification.
