Eligibility

Terms

Grant recipients may only use the grant to pay for registration to the Northland Chapter of ATSSA How-To Annual Conference. Recipients of this grant are expected to attend the full conference. Recipients may be asked for testimonials at the conclusion of the conference in order to promote highway safety within the education arena.
