FAST Act TTP Funding

- ▶ Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act
- ▶ 5 year Highway Bill (FY16 - FY20)
- ▶ Tribal Transportation Program (TTP) Funding
 - ▶ FY16 to FY20 - \$2.425 Billion
 - ▶ FY21 - \$505 Million

Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (HIP-CRRSAA)

- ▶ \$114,568,862 for activities eligible under the Tribal Transportation Program (TTP)
- ▶ \$114,454,293 After Administrative takedown
- ▶ Does not provide for TTP set-asides
- ▶ Not subject to obligation limitation
- ▶ Explicit eligibility language
- ▶ Planning Requirements
- ▶ Reporting Requirements

2021 TTPSF Basics

\$8.9 Million available

9/9/2021 Application Deadline

Categories

- ▶ Safety Plans New/Updates
- ▶ Data assessment, improvement, or analysis
- ▶ Infrastructure Improvement
 - **New Selection Criteria** for infrastructure improvement category, provide evidence (study/publication) of expected crash reduction.
- ▶ **NEW Category:** Systemic Roadway Departure Countermeasures
 - Selection based on risk assessment, not just on crash history.

Systemic Roadway Departure Countermeasures Eligible Improvements

Funding Priority	Curves	Tangents
Curve Warning Signs	1	
Delineators	2	6
New Center/Edge Striping	3	7
Edge Rumbles	4	8
Center Rumbles	5	9
Clear Zones	10	11



Risk level will be considered when selecting sites for improvement under this new category.

Higher risk sites may receive funding for lower priority improvements before other sites receive funding for higher priority improvements.



Risk level will be determined based on geometrics, speeds, and other factors -- not exclusively based on crash history.

TTP Bridge Program

- ▶ 23 CFR 661 Rulemaking
 - ▶ Consistency with MAP-21 and FAST Act
 - ▶ Updated Terminology
- ▶ FY 21 Bridge Funding
 - ▶ \$13.4M Available
 - ▶ \$28.8M in Applications
 - ▶ 13 of 21 Applications Funded

FLH Research Program

- ▶ FY20 Program Awarded 4 Projects (\$800K):
 - ▶ Making Transportation Planning Applicable in Tribal Communities - \$300K
 - ▶ Applying FHWA's Vulnerability Assessment and Adaptation Framework to Tribal Communities - \$100K
 - ▶ Ice Road Establishment and Management AND Trail and Shelter Protocols and Standards \$400K
- ▶ FY21
 - ▶ \$2.4M Available
 - ▶ 6 Tribal Problem Statements
 - ▶ Announcement Pending



Office of Tribal Transportation

The Office of Tribal Transportation (OTT) administers the Tribal Transportation Program (TTP) and provides stewardship and oversight for direct funding agreements with 135 federally recognized Tribes. The OTT also provides support for all FHWA activities affecting tribal transportation. This support includes the administration of TIGER/BUILD grants awarded to Tribes, and the transfer of funds from States and other local governments to Tribes through the 202(a)(9) transfer process.

In addition, the FHWA Office of Tribal Transportation manages the Tribal Transportation Program Bridge Program and the Tribal Transportation Program Safety Fund for all federally recognized Tribes. These grant programs are set-asides from the overall Tribal Transportation Program.

The mission of the FHWA Office of Tribal Transportation is:

Through mutual respect and understanding, enhance the quality of life in Tribal communities by supporting the Tribes' delivery of transportation programs.

Tribal Transportation Program

TTP is the largest program in the Office of Federal Lands Highway. Established in 23 U.S.C. 202 to address the transportation needs of Tribal governments throughout the United States, the program is receiving \$455 million in FY 2016, with increases of \$10
