

TRACTOR MOWER SAFETY

25 Rules to Practice for Safe Tractor Mowing

- 1. Safety is the responsibility of every operator
 - Think Safety at all time to prevent accidents.
 - Follow safety rules in the operator's manual
- 2. Always use 3-point of contact facing the tractor while mounting/dismounting
- 3. Do not operate malfunctioning equipment
- 4. Avoid wearing loose clothing around equipment machinery
- 5. Always wear your seat belt know your agencies seat belt policy
- 6. Keep all safety shields in place
- 7. Ensure warning lights are working
- 8. Keep blades sharp and equipment in good condition
- 9. Know the location of controls, safety features
- 10. Monitor your gauges for safe ranges
- 11. Keep the equipment clean do a daily walk around
- 12. Before operating any equipment, ensure no one is near the equipment
- 13. Test all controls after starting
- 14. Keep a safe distance from people
- 15. Watch out for obstacles
 - a. Electrical lines
 - b. Overhead clearances
 - c. Traffic and railroad tracks



- 16. Stay in gear when traveling downhill
- 17. Go slow when mowing in tall weeds
- 18. Do NOT mow slopes steeper than 3:1
- 19. Check on co-workers periodically
- 20. Always operate the controls from the tractor's seat
- 21. Before leaving the tractor seat:
 - a. Place tractor in PARK or NEUTRAL
 - b. Set the parking brake
 - c. Disengage the PTO
 - d. Shut off the engine
 - e. Remove the key
 - f. Wait for all moving parts to stop
- 22. Never mount of dismount a moving tractor
- 23. Never leave running equipment unattended
- 24. Never place any part of your body under a mower until the mower is properly supported
- 25. Never park equipment in areas of traffic hazards

Action Items:

- Be aware of what is going on around you— be alert and aware at all times never be a distracted operator
- Wear the proper PPE at all times High visibility safety vests should be worn at all times (class II or class III), hearing protection, gloves, rain gear, safety toe footwear
- Have a first aid kit available
- Know the area you are planning to mow looking for large rocks or other large objects, slopes steeper than 3:1, steep banks, ditches or wet areas
- Do daily inspections of every piece of equipment, inside and out make sure that you document the inspection
