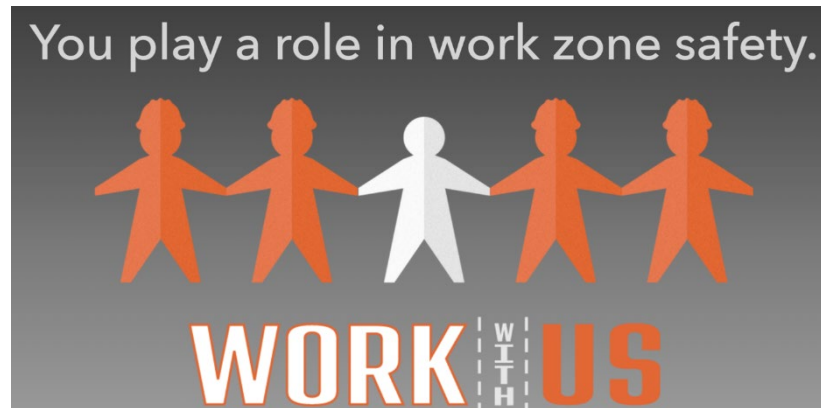


## National Work Zone Awareness Week, April 17-21, 2023

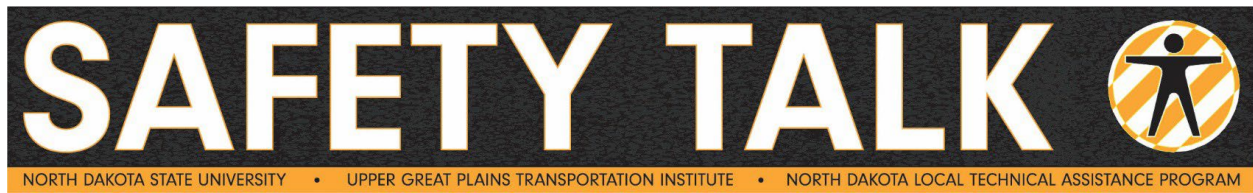
