How-To Conference Grant Program (Local Gov)

We are excited to announce that in partnership with the Northland Chapter of American Traffic Safety Services Association (ATSSA), we are offering a limited number of grants to the Northland Chapter of ATSSA How-To Conference held in Fargo, ND (typically in March of each year). This unique offering is intended to raise awareness, overall knowledge, and networking opportunities in the transportation safety industry.

Eligibility

Grants are available to local government employees/officials that are attending the conference for the first time and be either decision makers or workers in inspection, or maintenance of pavement markings, traffic signs, and temporary work zone traffic controls. Applicants must be employed with a county, city, township, or similar who work with roadway signing, markings, work zones, etc. on the roadway in order to be eligible.

Terms

Grant recipients may only use the grant to pay for registration to the Northland Chapter of ATSSA How-To Annual Conference. Recipients of this grant are expected to attend the full conference. Recipients may be asked for testimonials at the conclusion of the conference in order to promote highway safety for our local government officials.

Applicants are evaluated by a NDSU UGPTI NDLTAP selection committee. Selection criteria taken into consideration are:

- Applicant's position within their county, city, township, etc.
- Applicant's potential to contribute to roadway & work zone safety
- Applicant's need for assistance
- Past participation at the Northland Chapter of ATSSA How-To Conference
