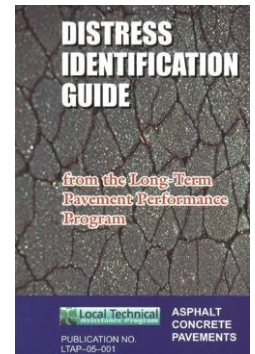

Field training/hands-on- street repairs by all participants (1 p.m. – 4 p.m.)

This work will be on a street section. As a participant you are required to bring high-visibility vests, safety glasses, gloves and clothes that can get oil stained.

Class participants will be divided into three groups:

- Pavement condition review (participants will determine repair methods that fit)
- Spray patching – learn best practices for repairing potholes (participants will repair potholes)
- Crack sealing – learn the oil types and methods (participants will seal pavement cracks)
