Those involved in work zone projects should have a basic knowledge of temporary traffic control so that they can help install traffic control devices, monitor their performance, recognize deficiencies during the course of a project. This knowledge will help them work safely protect others in a work zone.

The one-day Work Zone Safety course provides:

- an introduction to temporary traffic control in work zones for individuals who work in the field
- approaches for installing/removing traffic control devices and working within a work zone
- concepts, techniques and practices in the installation and maintenance of traffic control devices
- tips for recognizing hazards in the work zone
- an overview of liability issues
- instruction on the importance of uniformity in the work zone and how to achieve it
